



Mentoring Days

What is a Mentoring Day?

Depending on the size of a church Sozo team & the frequency of Sozos, it can take some time for someone to gain sufficient experience and confidence to progress from a "Second" to a "First". Attending a Mentoring Day is an opportunity to accelerate your development ministry growth. We all learn best by observing and "doing", a mentoring day gives you an opportunity to gain experience & learning much quicker than normal.

Format of the day

The day will be highly interactive and flexible with a lot of participation. It will include;

- Brief recap of the major tools
- Recap of the importance of the Core Values
- Working in larger groups on set piece scenarios
- Working in groups of three to "practice" the main tools with each other
- Opportunity to share experiences and lessons learned in home church teams
- Plenty of time for Questions & Answers

Delegates work in groups with an experienced "First" acting as facilitator. These Firsts and the Facilitator will rotate around the groups so that delegates get to experience different "personalities" and styles of leading a Sozo.

To keep these more public settings for having a mini-Sozo a "safe place", the group First may interject at any time if they believe it is necessary for the Sozo to conclude or be "parked" for the sake of the person having a sozo.

There are occasionally longer Intensive Mentoring events over 2 or 3 days giving you even greater opportunity to develop your Sozo ministry.
